Further information about Mr and Mrs Alfred STERN has now been obtained from the Central National Registration Office as follows:-

Alfred STERN went to Canada some time in, or after, 1938. It is not known whether he has returned.

Mrs Lilian Henrietta STERN, whose C.N.R.O. number is ARPK/93/3, was born on 13.11.80; on National Registration Day she was at 93 Chiltern Court, Baker Street; moved on 6.6.40. to the St Pancras area, to Crescent House, Ilkley on 20.11.40. and to The Red House, The Grove, Ilkley on 6.1.41. She has just notified a change of address to Troutbeck Hydro, Ilkley, and it is understood that she is leaving for London in a fortnight. Attached to her Identity Card (apparently the last time she visited the N.R.O. at Ilkley) was a visiting card "Mrs Alfred STERN, 93 Chiltern Court, Baker Street, London" and written across it in her own handwriting was "care of Mrs DALE EVANS, 9 Melville Hall, Holly Road, Edgbaston."

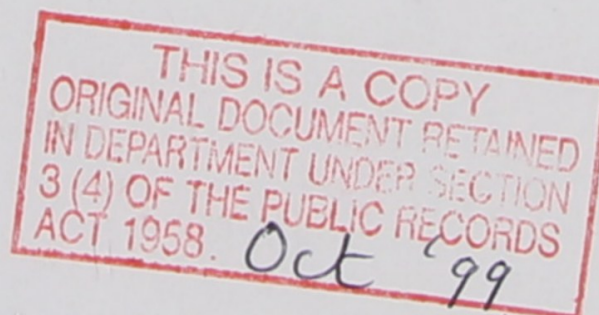

Dear Major Hordern,

When this Swedish subject, who was undoubtedly a German agent, was arrested on attempting to leave the country via Gravesend on 16.12.39, various names were found in her note-book, one of which was William WEISS, 4 Hyde Park Place, W.2. When subsequently questioned about William WEISS, My ERIKSSON said she met him with the Duchesse de CHATEAU-THIERRY, and that he was a friend of the Duchess' friend Miss STEIN, who had taken refugees under her wing.

~~William WEISS~~, a Czech subject, born 25.3.93, who arrived in this country on 19.2.39, and is now living at 135 Sandringham Court, W.9. has now been interviewed by Special Branch. He states that he is an expert in the scientific breeding and fattening of cattle and on reaching this country in 1939, he called on a number of Czech and Hungarian produce marketing concerns in London in an endeavour to establish business connections here. While so doing, he made the acquaintance of a Hungarian named VARGHA who introduced him to a Hungarian woman named Maria NERMI who was said to be an operatic singer. Maria NERMI told him about a certain Mrs STEIN, who then lived at Chiltern Court, Baker Street, W.1, and was a person of wealth who kept an open house for refugees of good education who were friendless in London. WEISS said that he was, for business reasons, anxious to meet English people and he therefore asked Miss NERMI to take him along to Mrs STEIN's flat. For several months he was a frequent visitor to her flat and continued to call on her until about February 1940 when she moved out of town. She is now said to live at The Red House, The Grove, Ilkley, Yorkshire. WEISS several times met the [Duchess of CHATEAU-THIERRY] at STEIN's flat and on

one occasion she was accompanied by My ERIKSSON. Two or three days later, WEISS met ERIKSSON in Oxford Street by appointment, after which he took her to his flat at 4 Hyde Park Place. After some questioning he reluctantly admitted that he invited her solely for an immoral purpose. He saw her once again about a week before Christmas 1939, when she was on her way through London en route for Sweden.

Mrs STERN is, in all probability, the wife of ~~Alfred STERN~~ who, according to the London directory, is the tenant of 93 Chiltern Court, Baker Street. ~~We~~ have one trace of Alfred STERN when in May 1939, Albert JANOWITZ, a Polish or German Jew then in Poland, sent a letter through STERN of Chiltern Court to Prince MIODOWSKI, a Pole, who was arrested in January 1940 for obtaining a British passport by false pretences. JANOWITZ, who is gated, is known to have taken a prominent part in a conspiracy to obtain British passports for aliens by false pretences.

In view of their connection with My ERIKSSON and the Duchess of CHATEAU-THIERRY, I should be most grateful for any information you could let me have about the present activities, etc. of Mr and Mrs STERN of The Red House, The Grove, Ilkeley, Yorks., but am anxious that they should not, at the present stage, become aware that enquiries are being made.



Sir,

6683 Schateau Thierry was today visited for 15 minutes by Mrs. Elam, 5, Logan Place, W.8. The whole conversation concerned domestic affairs and Mrs. Elam enquired after several people in E. Wing. [Schateau Thierry] told her visitor she was very surprised at that awful [Erikson] being released, as she herself had been told that she was detained here for harbouring Erikson and if she would give information she would be released, but she did not know anything, the woman went to her and told her a pack of lies.

Miss Føllesdal stated that both she and her friend were greatly helped by a co-detainee, a Swedish woman named ERIKSSON. This woman, whom she describes as being very attractive and of a very good class, told them that she had been interned for nearly two years on suspicion of espionage. "Exactly" added Miss FØLLESDAL "as my friend and I". This statement implies, of course, that she considers the charges against her are of a similar nature.

My ERICCCSON.

When VERA first went to Holloway, this woman frequently visited her in her cell and although at first she was nice to VERA she then turned round and upbraided her, saying that VERA had taken her name and that it was on VERA's account that ERICCCSON was in prison. VERA described ERICCCSON as a good hausfrau, who although she had lived in this country for years, is always talking about returning to her children in Sweden. VERA understood that RANZAU had known ERICCCSON for many years, and she said that she was engaged to be married to RANTZAU. VERA considers that ERICCCSON is almost mental and that she is suffering from persecution mania and is extremely touchy.

With reference to M.I.5. letter, PF.47928/B.4a./JMC., dated 10th. December, 1941 asking for further enquiries to be made concerning certain names found in a diary in the possession of My ERIKSSON when she was arrested on 16th. December, 1939:

William WEISS and Cyril MackENZIE have been seen as requested. RECORDED

William WEISS was born on 25th. September, 1893, at Topoleany, Czechoslovakia, formerly Hungary. He is registered with police, as a Czech, serial No. E.Z.336341. and is in possession of Czechoslovakian passport Bo.252/38. issued in Topoleany, on 11th. August, 1938. He arrived in this country as a refugee on 19th. February, 1939.

WEISS stated that he is an expert in the scientific breeding and fattening of cattle and was formerly a partner in one of the leading agricultural produce enterprises in Czechoslovakia. On reaching this country in 1939 he decided to endeavour to establish some business connections here and to this end he called on a number of Czech and Hungarian produce marketing concerns in London.

Whilst so doing he made the acquaintance of a Hungarian named VARGHA (he does not remember his christian names). They met on several occasions and at one of these meetings he was introduced to a Hungarian woman named Maria NERMI, who was said to be an operatic singer. In the course of the conversation Maria NERMI told him about a certain Mrs. STERN who then resided at Chiltern Court, Baker Street, W.1. She said that Mrs. STERN was a person of wealth who kept an open house for refugees of good education who were friendless in London.

WEISS stated that at that time he had no friends in London and was anxious to meet English people in the hope that they might introduce him to persons likely to be interested in his business projects. He, therefore, asked Miss NERMI to take him along to Mrs. STERN's flat. This she did and he was introduced to Mrs. STERN.

For several months following he was a frequent visitor to her flat. He is not clear as to exact dates but thinks that he continued to call on Mrs. STERN until about February, 1940 when she moved out of town. She now lives at 'The Red House', The Grove, Ilkeley, Yorkshire.

It seems that Mrs. STERN used to entertain many alien refugees of good birth and education. It was the practice of these aliens to call on her from time to time without a formal invitation and spend an hour or so in her company discussing, in English, their doubts and difficulties.

WEISS says that he frequently talked to her of his scheme to establish a system of intensive cattle feeding

here and she took a sympathetic interest in his endeavours.

On one occasion he met there the Duchess de Chateau Thierry. They talked together in German for some time and eventually she said that she knew an Englishman who might be interested in his scheme.

Later Mrs. SPERN arranged a dinner party at her flat where the Duchess introduced WEISS to a man named ROBERTS who was described as the Duchess's solicitor, with an office near the Strand. The two men discussed business at great length but nothing came of it.

About a week after this WEISS again met the Duchess at Mrs. SPERN's flat and on this occasion she was accompanied by My ERIKSSON. WEISS was introduced to her and for about an hour they conversed together. He says that he cannot remember what they talked about but is certain it was ordinary polite conversation with no significance of any kind. He did learn, however, that she was living at the house of Lord Derwent, near Scarborough, he thinks, either as a housekeeper or secretary.

Two or three days later he met ERIKSSON in Oxford Street, by appointment, and they went to the Regal Cinema, Marble Arch. After leaving the cinema he took her to his flat at 4, Hyde Park Place W.2. for coffee. After some questioning he reluctantly admitted that he invited her to his flat solely for an immoral purpose and did, in fact, have sexual intercourse with her. They remained in his flat for about an hour after which she returned, by cab, to the Duchess's flat at Dorset House.

WEISS says that he met ERIKSSON once more a week or so before Christmas, 1939 when he received a message from her to say that she was passing through London en route for a holiday in Sweden. He called on her at 102, Dorset House, N.W.1. but was not alone with her for more than a moment. She gave him her address in Sweden and asked him to write to her. She also promised to visit him again at his flat when she returned to town. He sent her a card at Christmas also a short note but received no reply and has not seen or heard of her since. Neither has he seen the Duchess of Chateau Thierry.

Throughout the interview WEISS was very vague as to dates and times but seemed reasonably certain that he first met ERIKSSON in late October or November, 1939 and saw her the last time about four or five weeks later. These dates are approximately correct as ERIKSSON said she was living in Scarborough. Actually she was employed by Lord Derwent, Hackness Hall, Scarborough from 29th. July, 1939 to 8th. November, 1939 and was probably in London for a few days before she was arrested on 16th. December, 1939 when on her way to Sweden.

WEISS was open and frank at the interview, except when dealing with the occasion when he took ERIKSSON to his flat and nothing transpired to indicate that his connection with her was anything but that of a casual acquaintance and he did not, in my opinion, have any knowledge of the fact that she was a German agent.

He is a Jew and has all the shrewd business instincts of
 race. It is clear that he was impressed by the persons he met at
 Mrs. STERN's flat and he continued to visit her in the hope that he
 would eventually meet someone there who was willing to help him to
 establish himself in business here.

He says he was not impressed by the Duchess de Chateau Thierry.
 He found her to be very pro-Nazi and often wondered why she was not
 arrested. He was at a loss to understand why she invited Jewish
 refugees to her flat and after one or two visits he decided to stay
 away.

 Abbey Road, N.W.5. He is a captain on the General List and is employed
 in the offices at the Sub-Area Quartering Commandant, 57, Queens
 Gate, S.W. He holds the D.S.O. (1916) and M.C. He was formerly a
 director of W. MacKENZIE and Co., Ltd., Christmas card publishers, 48/52
 Banner Street, E.C.6.

The photographs attached to M.I.5. letter were shown to him
 but he could not identify them, neither had he any knowledge of the
 three women mentioned. He said that in the course of his business
 he saw travellers from a number of German printing houses from time
 to time but not after war broke out. He cannot remember having
 had any contact with aliens during the second half of 1939.

Capt. MacKENZIE was not very helpful. He boasted of his
 connections abroad principally at the Le Touquet Casino. He said
 that before the war he spent many months there each year and was
 well known in the gaming rooms. In consequence of this he had
 many alien acquaintances and was known by sight and reputation to many
 more.

There is no trace in Special Branch records, on the
 particulars available, of the aliens VARGA and Maria MERL.

ERIKSSON, Josephine F.E. (Your Ref. E.323.)

Your letter of the 27.12.41 to Renton, (who has now left us,) has been passed to me. I am afraid that we should not now or at any future time be prepared to approve of this woman's transfer to Port Erin. Since our letter of the 20.2.40 to which you refer, she has been closely associated with two other women in whom we are very interested at Holloway, and we should be very much opposed to any information which she has obtained from these sources going back to Germany, as it undoubtedly would if she were placed in any camp from which internees were subsequently repatriated. Moreover, the inevitable lack of effective security at Port Erin, which possesses practically none of the safeguards of an ordinary internment camp, makes it the worst possible place to send a woman of this type. Inspector Cuthbert, when I last spoke to him, expressed his concern at the possibility of escape to Ireland on fishing boats. This is a real danger since the layout of the Camp makes it impossible in practice to deny access to the quay to the internees, and indeed it is currently believed among them that in the early days three of their number did in fact escape by this means.

It is also worth remarking that any sympathy for Mrs. ERIKSSON's present situation would, in our opinion, be wholly misplaced. She is a German spy, who is lucky to be in Holloway as a detainee instead of as a convict.

I have your letter of the 9th December regarding the above named and have noted your objections to her proposed transfer to the Isle of Man.

While the question of contact with women who may be repatriated is fully appreciated, there remains the fact that she has now been in imprisonment and in prison detention for nearly two years and we are, therefore, particularly anxious to get her out to a camp. In the earlier stages of the case when the file was referred to you on the question of sending this woman back to Sweden you expressed the opinion (on 20/2/40) that any information she might have collected prior to her arrest would be thoroughly stale and you offered no objection to her repatriation.

While the question of contact with women who may be repatriated is fully appreciated, there remains the fact that she has now been in imprisonment and in prison detention for nearly two years and we are, therefore, particularly anxious to get her out to a camp. In the earlier stages of the case when the file was referred to you on the question of sending this woman back to Sweden you expressed the opinion (on 20/2/40) that any information she might have collected prior to her arrest would be thoroughly stale and you offered no objection to her repatriation.

You will no doubt remember having made various enquiries into the different contacts of the above named Swedish subject, who is a German agent at present interned in Holloway. Inspector Rogers dealt with this case, and his last report was No: 405/41/933 of 20th May 1941.

When My ERIKSSON was arrested on attempting to leave the country via Gravesend on 16th December, 1939, various names were found in her note book. (Special Branch report 320/EPA/2389 of 16th December 1939 refers) These included the following:-

William WEISS, 4, Hyde Park Place, W.2.

Cyril MackENZIE (now believed to be in France).

Marjorie BUCKLER Aero Club. (Now believed to be in Denmark).

Nellie NEUMANN, c/o Mrs. Lichtenstein, 18 Cleve House, Cleve Rd., N.W.6.

Of these the last three seemed to have been written by Mrs. ERIKSSON while in the train on her way to Gravesend, and her explanation was that Vera de SCHALBERG, a Dane of 195, Avenue Paul Derchanal, Brussels, had, while staying with Nellie NEUMANN before the war, asked her (MY) to obtain their addresses in order to enable her (Vera) to write to them. (Vera de SCHALBERG @ Vera ERICHSEN was, as you know, a German agent, who, prior to the outbreak of war, acted as housekeeper to the Duchesse de CHATEAU THIERY.* She subsequently returned to this country, since the outbreak of war, as a German agent, and was arrested).

* 9 102 Dorset Court, Grosvenor Place.

William WEISS is a Czech subject born 25.7.93 who is the subject of Metropolitan Police reports under the references 74/40/1847, H.O.W./1157/2, the latest being dated 3.4.41. On 26.5.41 he moved to Machynlleth, Montgomeryshire, where he hoped to take up work on a farm which a friend proposed buying. He has, however, apparently returned to London as, according to the Central National Registration Office, his present address is 135, Sandringham Court, W.9. When questioned on 22.2.40 about William WEISS, My ERIKSSON said she met him with the Duchesse de CHATEAU THIERY, and that he was a friend of the Duchess' friend Miss STEIN, who had taken refugees under her wing.

Search of the Passport Office records and enquiry at the Central Registration Office makes it seem likely that Cyril MackENZIE is identical with Cyril MackENZIE born 23.8.96 whose present address is, 7 Garden Court, N.W.8 and whose occupation is given as "Joint Managing Director, Printers and Publishers". When questioned at Holloway on 22.2.40 My ERIKSSON said Cyril MackENZIE was "a gentleman she didn't know".

We have made enquiries but it has not yet been possible to trace Marjorie BUCKLER.

Nellie NEUMANN is identical with Helene Sara NEUMANN, German, born 24.9.04 at Vienna, whose permanent address is care of her great-aunt, Cleve House

Cleve Road, N.W.6. She has stated that she met My ERIKSSON when both were working for Lady EDEN at Fritham House, Near Lyndhurst, Hants., and she has denied all knowledge of Vera ERICHSEN alia Vera de SCHALBERG.

I should be grateful if you would kindly arrange for both Cyril MacKENZIE and William WEISS to be interviewed and asked what connections, if any, they had with:-

- (1) Mrs. Josephine Phillipine Emillie (known as My) ERIKSSON.
(2 copies of photo attached)
- (2) Vera ERICHSEN alias Vera de SCHALBERG.
(2 copies of photo attached).
- (3) Nellie (or Helene) NEUMANN.

If they can put forward no likely explanation as to why My ERIKSSON had written these names in her book, they might be asked for the names of any aliens with whom they were in contact in the latter half of 1939 who might have passed on the names to Mrs. ERIKSSON. The attached list of Mrs. My ERIKSSON'S movements since 1936 may possibly help in the interrogation.


Dear Courtice,

Your AP.122303 of 17th November has been passed to me by Colonel Hinchley Cooke as our files on Mrs. Josephine Fillippine Emillie ERIKSSON are in my possession. We have a number of volumes in the file on this woman, but of these volumes two covering inter alia the period December 1939 were, I very much regret to state, destroyed by enemy action. I have had a careful search made and there is no trace of this woman's Passport Papers, and it seems probable that they were in one of the destroyed volumes.

Our records show that in December, 1939 she was in possession of a Swedish Passport, number 81, issued in London on 23.7.34 and valid until 23.7.44. She was issued with an Exit Permit number 122303 valid until 11.1.40 (THRF/39/4) She had been issued in London with a Dutch visa, on 14.12.39, valid for a journey to the Netherlands within 2 months.



William WEISS, formerly Hungarian, Czech by Treaty.

Born 25.7.93. at Topolcany.

R.C. No: 631238, Serial Number EZ 336341.

Czech Passport No: 252/1938 issued at Topolcany.

William WEISS was, with his brother Hermann, a cattle-breeder in Vienna III St. Marx.

He was subsequently managing director of Bohumil Jirotko a Spol of 5, Liliova, Prague, a company formed in 1937 which conducted a research library for the adoption of patents and discoveries.

WEISS arrived at Dover from Calais on 19.2.39. He then had £1,000 to his credit at the Anglo-Czechoslovak and Prague Credit Bank, London, allowed him by the National Bank of Czecho-Slovakia for the purpose of forming a company in this country, which he registered on 9.3.39. as Jirotko Products & Research Ltd. WEISS attempted to introduce two inventions in this country - a patent onion-peeling machine and a process for purifying mud, but both projects fell through and Jirotko Products & Research Ltd. now exists in name only, having never engaged in any active business.

In the spring of 1940 WEISS was given permission to act as managing director of the Lytham Home Farm Produce Ltd. at a farm they proposed starting in Lancs., but the company never actually functioned. A proposal early in 1941 that he should manage a pig-breeding farm in Reading for a sausage manufacturer called Morris BLOOM of 111, Wentworth St., E. also came to nothing, as did a project of making cheese from ewes milk at a farm at Goring-on-Thames owned by a Mr. Harris of 80, Wardour St. W.1.

William WEISS has apparently lived at both 4 and 5 Hyde Park Place, W.2. On 26.3.41. he moved to Machynlleth, Montgomeryshire, where his address in April 1941 was the Wynnstay Hotel. He was interviewed on 15.4.41. by the Police, and stated he had gone to Wales at the request of Mr. Frank KOLISCH, Llwynygog, Pantperthog, Machynlleth, who intended buying a farm on which WEISS could work. Alternatively WEISS had a Hungarian friend in Torquay (believed to be the Baron Hatvany) who intended buying a farm in Totness on which WEISS might work.

If both plans came to nothing he intended returning to London to seek another job.

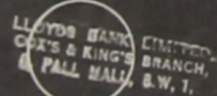

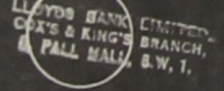
